

Foreign Languages

The Language Department includes thorough training in four foreign languages: German, French, Spanish, and Latin. The first three are taught with a view towards proficiency in conversation as well as reading, and most of the language teachers are either native or have studied in the countries whose language they teach. Study is always tied up with an understanding of the cultural contributions, past and present, of the country.

In Latin classes the students cover grammar, sentence structure, and vocabulary and also read some of the Latin classics. This helps them clarify, enrich, and diversify their English and also aids in their knowledge of other languages.

Electives

Elective courses in Art, Music, Drama, Economics, Psychology, Philosophy and Comparative Religion further round out the educational program and help the boys and girls gain broad cultural backgrounds. Current problems in research are stressed and the students encouraged to concentrate in fields where specialized knowledge and training is badly needed. Every effort is made to teach the students how this newly acquired knowledge fits into the pattern of their daily lives.
